CITY OF TREES CHALLENGE

The City of Trees Challenge continues to be a successful Network program, and one that showcases the impact of collaboration. Since 2020 we have planted over 14,760 trees in neighborhoods and parks across Boise and in 2022 we launched our Boise Tree Captains Program, engaged community volunteers and hosted multiple tours with key community partners and supporters. In partnership with Boise City Council President Elaine Clegg, Treasure Valley Canopy Network, City of Boise and The Nature Conservancy in Idaho will plan for, plant and grow one tree for every household in Boise (100,000 urban trees) and one seedling for every Boise resident in an Idaho forest (235,000 forest seedlings) by 2030.



IN THE CITY

Partnering with the City of Boise, we hosted our first cohort of Boise Tree Captains! Over 20 Boise residents were recruited and trained in basic tree care and to identify areas within their own neighborhoods that could use more trees. The Captains located homes for over 100 trees in neighborhoods across Boise that will benefit from increased tree canopy to reduce urban heat and improve health and wellbeing of these neighborhoods. Their efforts culminated in an October community planting day in partnership with City of Good and over 20 community volunteers who planted these trees in neighborhoods across the city.



IN THE FOREST

Alongside The Nature Conservancy, 149,000 forest seedlings have been planted in Boise National Forest -- which puts us over halfway towards our goal! Species include ponderosa pine and Douglas fir trees that will improve soil stability and forest health in the 2016 Pioneer Fire scar. Partial funding for the seedlings has come from the Arbor Day Foundation (ADF), who sent 20 of their staff to Boise this summer to celebrate Arbor Day Foundation's 50th Anniversary. During this celebration, the ADF team spent two days with the Network and City of Trees Challenge team touring forest seedling operations and our work throughout the City of Boise.

LOST GROVE SHADE CITY BREWFEST

Created by Lost Grove Brewing, Idaho Botanical Garden, and Treasure Valley Canopy Network, The Shade City Brewfest has a mission to celebrate Earth Day and our business community through an annual low-waste community celebration. An estimated 3,000 people attended the Inaugural Shade City Brewfest on Earth Day weekend in 2022! The Network helped raise awareness about Boise's urban forest and sustainability, and helped raise funding to support our programs and Lost Grove's contributing membership in the Network.



EXTRAMILE ARENA PUTTING DOWN ROOTS FOR GOOD

This concert season the Network partnered with ExtraMile Arena to support local musicians during their Boise performances in building climate action through the City of Trees Challenge. This effort raised funding to support planning, planting and care for over 1,000 trees across Boise and Idaho forests and helped ExtraMile Arena join the Network as a contributing member.

GROWING PROGRAMS

URBAN WOOD NETWORK



The Treasure Valley Urban Wood Network, a program of the Canopy Network that began in 2020, has been the catalyst for an Idaho Chapter of the National Urban Wood Network. Through this local program, we are committed to maximizing the value of local urban timber for cities, the tree care industry, millers and makers as well as supporting sustainability efforts through partnerships in the public and private sector. In 2022 we saw growth in Idaho memberships and our team is now working together with partners in Colorado, north Idaho and WA State to expand circular urban wood economic opportunities.

GROWING PROGRAMS

CITY FOREST CREDITS



In January 2022, as part of a national sale, the Network sold our first batch of 57 City Forest Credits for the Treasure Valley Municipal Parks Planting Project (a partnership with City of Boise). The funding from this sale supports Treasure Valley Canopy Network's City Forest Credits Program and City of Boise's future tree planting funds. We anticipate another batch of credits to be available for sale following verification in 2025.










ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT

2023 VISION AND GOALS

In 2022, the Network had great success growing our programming and organization: City of Trees Challenge; Idaho's Urban Wood Network; improved coordination and planning by the Board of Directors. We also successfully met and exceeded our goals for fundraising and contributing member growth. In addition to our success, we are experiencing growing-pains that are associated with this rapid growth - primarily staffing needs to continue to support and grow our programming. In 2023 we will: (1) Grow our Board of Directors and their governance structure and support of the organization; (2) Expand Member contributions to support an increase in staffing to meet the programming demands; (3) Continue to grow fundraising and partnership efforts at the local, regional and national level; (4) Support and expand upon existing programs with a focus on increasing staffing to maintain and improve program delivery.
